Meet Caleb Scott and his family:





Caleb is 10 years old and from Port Macquarie, NSW.

On the 4th of September 2015, Caleb's world was turned upside down when he was found to have a brain tumor.

He was flown to Sydney the following day to have surgery to remove the tumor.

Diagnosis is that he has a brain cancer called Medulloblastoma. The survival rate for medulloblastoma ranges from 30% to 80%, depending on factors such as the age of the child, and the 'risk level' of their tumour (low, average or high-risk).

Caleb is now facing a long period of treatment to cure the cancer and to hopefully resolve the facial paralysis he has been left with post op.

Cure My Brain is assisting with the funding of physio treatment for Caleb and we hope to help him with his facial paralysis.
